

## Hearing of Application for a Premises Licence

In accordance with section 11(1) of the Act, the Board considered an application for a Premises Licence.

## **ORDER**

Pursuant to section 11(2) of the Act, the Board orders the following:

- 1. The Applicant is hereby issued a Class A Premises Licence for the establishment known as Twist and Shout (lower level), located at 4915 50th Street in Yellowknife, NT.
- 2. The approved operating days and hours shall be: Thursday to Saturday 4:00pm to 2:00am and Sunday 4:00pm to 12:00am.
- 3. The Licence Holder shall post all signage as instructed by the Board.
- 4. No liquor may be transported, carried, consumed or otherwise in the possession of a patron outside the licensed premises including the area between the upper and lower level Twist and Shout licensed premises.
- 5. All liquor transported by the Licence Holder through non-licensed areas of the building must be unopened and within a closed container. No liquor purchased by a patron may be transported between the upper and lower level Licensed Premises.
- 6. Premises Licence #2017-A-18 for Twist and Shout (upper level) shall be amended to include the above-noted conditions.
- 7. Pursuant to section 83 of the Regulations, the notice period for the issuance of this licence is waived.
