



## Negotiated Contracts Policy Socioeconomic Progress Report

The Government of the Northwest Territories *Negotiated Contracts Policy* permits the negotiation of contracts outside the standard competitive contracting process when negotiations can reasonably be expected to:

- (1) Lead to benefits for businesses or residents which could not reasonably be expected to be achieved through competitive contracting; or
- (2) Contribute to the creation, growth, and competitive capacity of Northwest Territories-based businesses in a manner that complies with applicable trade agreements.

In awarding your organization a negotiated contract, it is essential that the GNWT monitor the socioeconomic benefits that have been achieved through the delivery of the contract/project. Accordingly, your contract requires the submission of this monthly socioeconomic progress report. The report will be required by the 15<sup>th</sup> day of each following month (e.g., a report for the month of May must be submitted by June 15<sup>th</sup>).

This socioeconomic progress report requirement is in addition to any reporting requirements under the GNWT Business Incentive Policy (such as the Substantiation of Business Incentive Policy Content Report).
