NTKey Registration Step by Step Instructions

The NTKey service is provided by the Government of the Northwest Territories to allow you to securely conduct online business with Government of the Northwest Territories departments.

The following instructions will assist you in setting up your NTKey – step-by-step.



Remember:

- One NTKey can be used to access multiple online services from the Government of the Northwest Territories.
- Your NTKey remains active if you use it. If you haven't used it in 2 years, or if you revoke it for any reason, you'll have to re-register.

Getting Started

To get started, select your preferred language.



Before using NTKey for the first time, you will need to register. The registration process will create your Username and Password.

To register for an NTKey, use your cursor to click the **Sign Up** link at the bottom of the login page.

NOTE: You will need to remember your Username and Password for future use and use it every time you use NTKey.



You are now on the Terms and Conditions page.

- First, read and accept the Terms and Conditions.
- When you've finished reading, click the "I accept" button.




Step 2 - Creating your Username

- Your username must contain:
 - Between 8 and 16 characters,
 - o May contain up to 7 digits, but,
 - No special characters, such as the pound sign (#)
- Choose a username that's easy to remember.

NOTE: You may want to write it down since you cannot retrieve your username if you forget it.

 Type your username in the white box, and click "Continue" when you are done.




Step 3 - Create a password

- Your password must be:
 - Between 8-16 characters
 - Cannot contain 3 consecutive characters from the Username
 - Some combination of upper and lower case letters, and,
 - o At least 1 digit.
- When you enter your password into the field, the password checklist shows you whether or not your password is valid
- Once you've entered your password, you'll need to type it again in the "confirm your password" box.



NOTE: If you don't type the same password into both boxes, an error message will appear asking you to retype the password into both boxes




- When both passwords match, the checklist will show your password as valid.
- Once you're done, click the "continue" button to move on.



Step 4 – Create your recovery questions and answers

The final step is to create your recovery questions, answers, and hints.

- This information will help you if you ever forget your NTKey password.
- You can choose from a number of recovery questions by clicking on the little arrow to the right of the "please select a question" bar.



- Move your cursor to the question you like best. You'll see the blue background highlights each question as you drag down the list.
- When the question you want is highlighted, click on it and that question will be chosen.




Type in the answer to your "recovery question" in the "recovery question" box.



Type in a memorable person and a 'hint' that will signal to you who that memorable person is.

 For example, your memorable person could be your daughter. So, you'll type her name in the "memorable person" box and 'daughter' in the "memorable person hint" box.



Type in a memorable date.

- Use 4 digits for the year, 2 digits for the month, and 2 digits for the day, separated by hyphens.
 - For example, you may want to choose the day your daughter was born. So, you'll type her birthday in the "memorable date" box.
 - In the "memorable date hint" box, type in a word or two that will help you remember the memorable date. For example, "daughter's birthday".

Step 5 – Continue using your chosen Government of the Northwest Territories Service

To return to the Government of the Northwest Territories online service where you started, click on the "Continue" button and you'll already be logged into the system using your new NTKey.



Remember:

- Your NTKey remains active if you use it. If you haven't used it in 2 years, or if you revoke it for any reason, you'll have to re-register.
- Depending on the service, you may also need to use a PIN or access code required by a Government of the Northwest Territories Department.
